



Power Automate for WooCommerce

Power Automate for WooCommerce enables your WooCommerce store to connect to over 675 services through Microsoft Power Automate, one of the most popular low-code platforms in the world.

Installation [🔗](#)

1. **Purchase** the plugin from the WooCommerce Marketplace.
2. **Download** the .zip file or alternatively, install it from the WooCommerce Marketplace and skip to step 4.
3. **Go to: WordPress Admin > Plugins > Add New** and **Upload Plugin** with the file you downloaded with **Choose File**.
4. **Install Now** and **Activate** the extension.

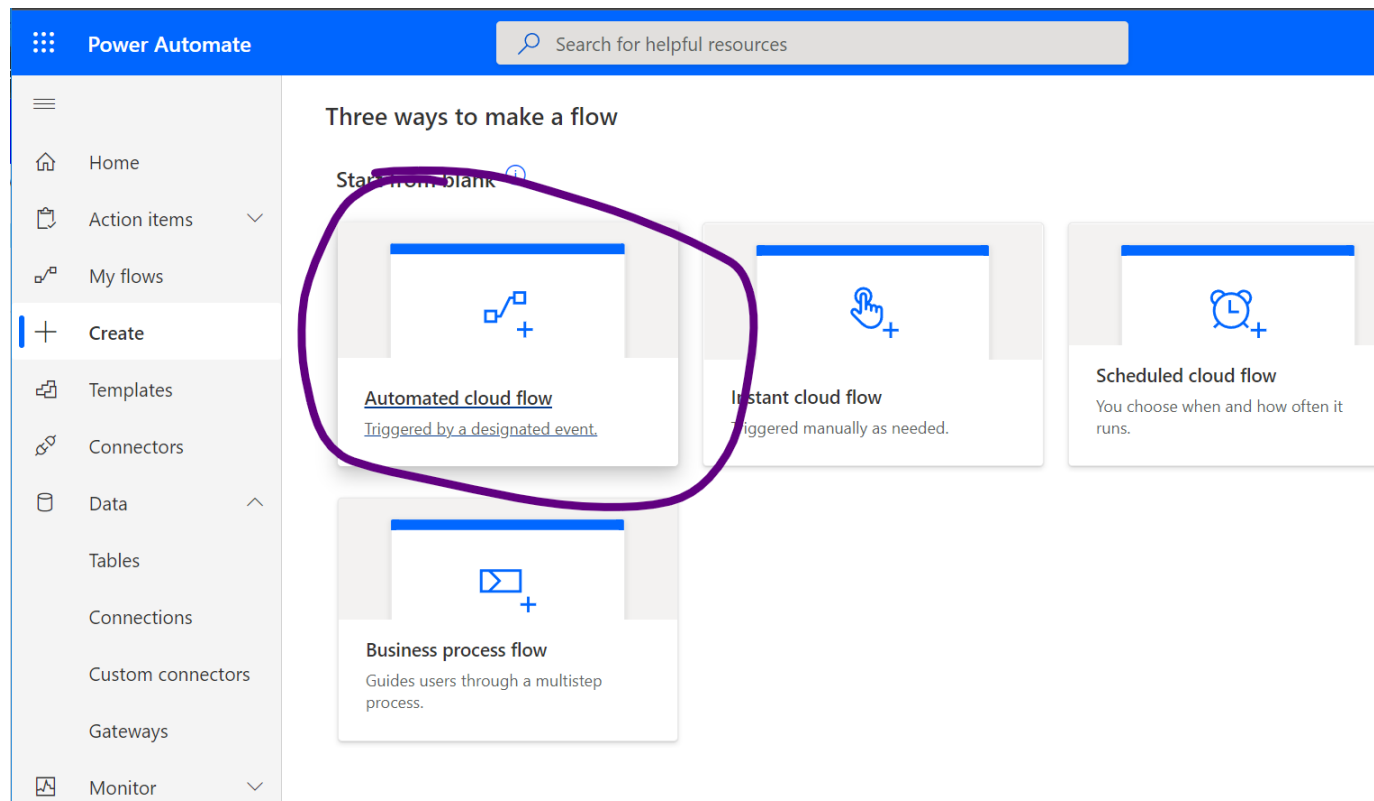
Setup and Configuration [🔗](#)

1. Create a **REST API Key** and make a note of the **Consumer Key** and **Consumer Secret**. **Go to: WordPress Admin > WooCommerce > Settings > Advanced > REST API**
2. Create your first **cloud flow** on [Microsoft Power Automate](#). When you select an action or trigger from the WooCommerce connector, enter your **WordPress Site URL** (without trailing /), **Consumer Key**, and **Consumer Secret** to complete your connection.
3. You can now use Power Automate with your WooCommerce store.

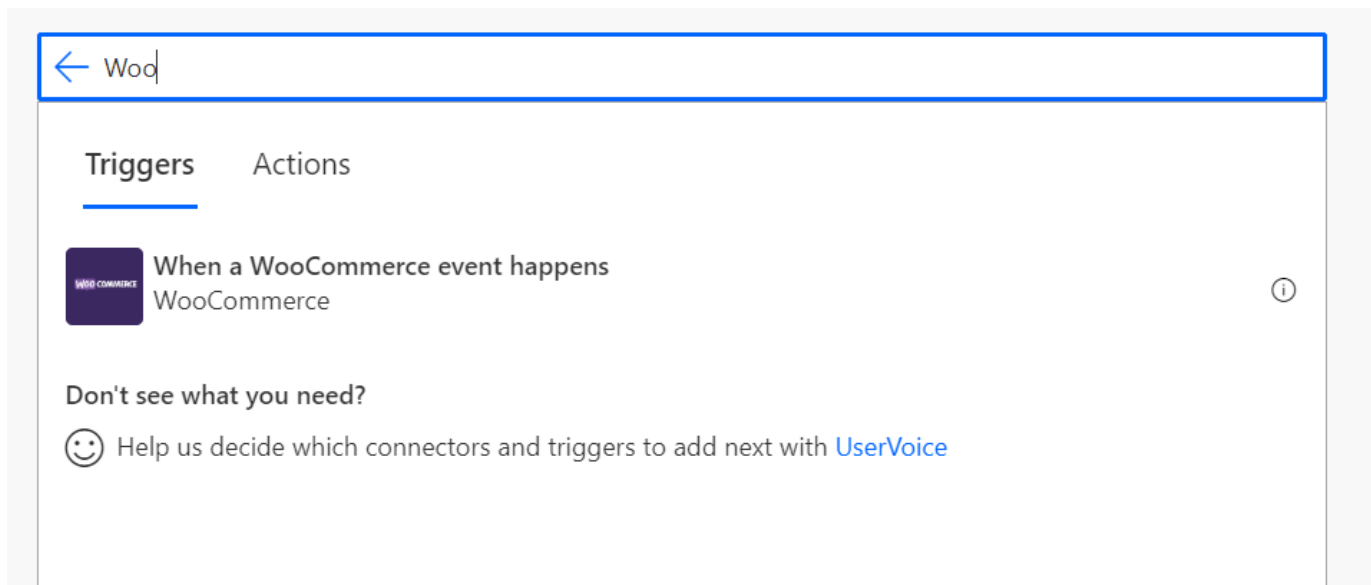
Triggers: Starting a flow when a WooCommerce event happens

To start flows when an event happens in WooCommerce, go to <https://flow.microsoft.com/> and then **+ Create > Automated Cloud Flow**. This is where you will build flows using the WooCommerce for Power Automate connector.



Starting a new Automated cloud flow

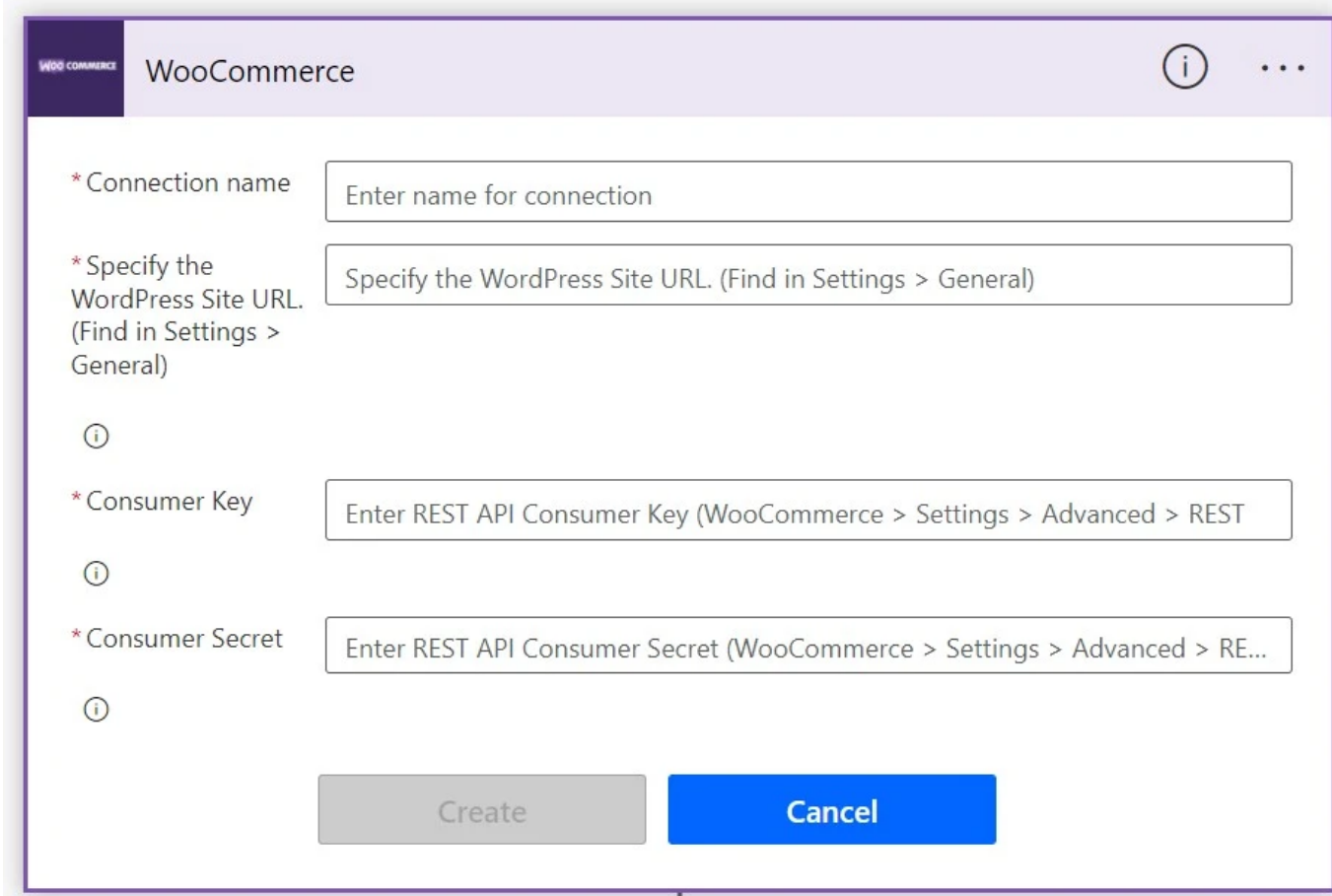
Type **Woo** and select **When a WooCommerce event happens**



The connector provides one enormously powerful trigger

Creating a new connection

When you choose your first action or trigger you will need to setup a connection to your store. To do this, enter a name for the connection, your **WordPress Site URL** (without trailing /), **Consumer Key** and **Consumer Secret**. This will establish a connection to your WooCommerce store. (See Figure 1 below)

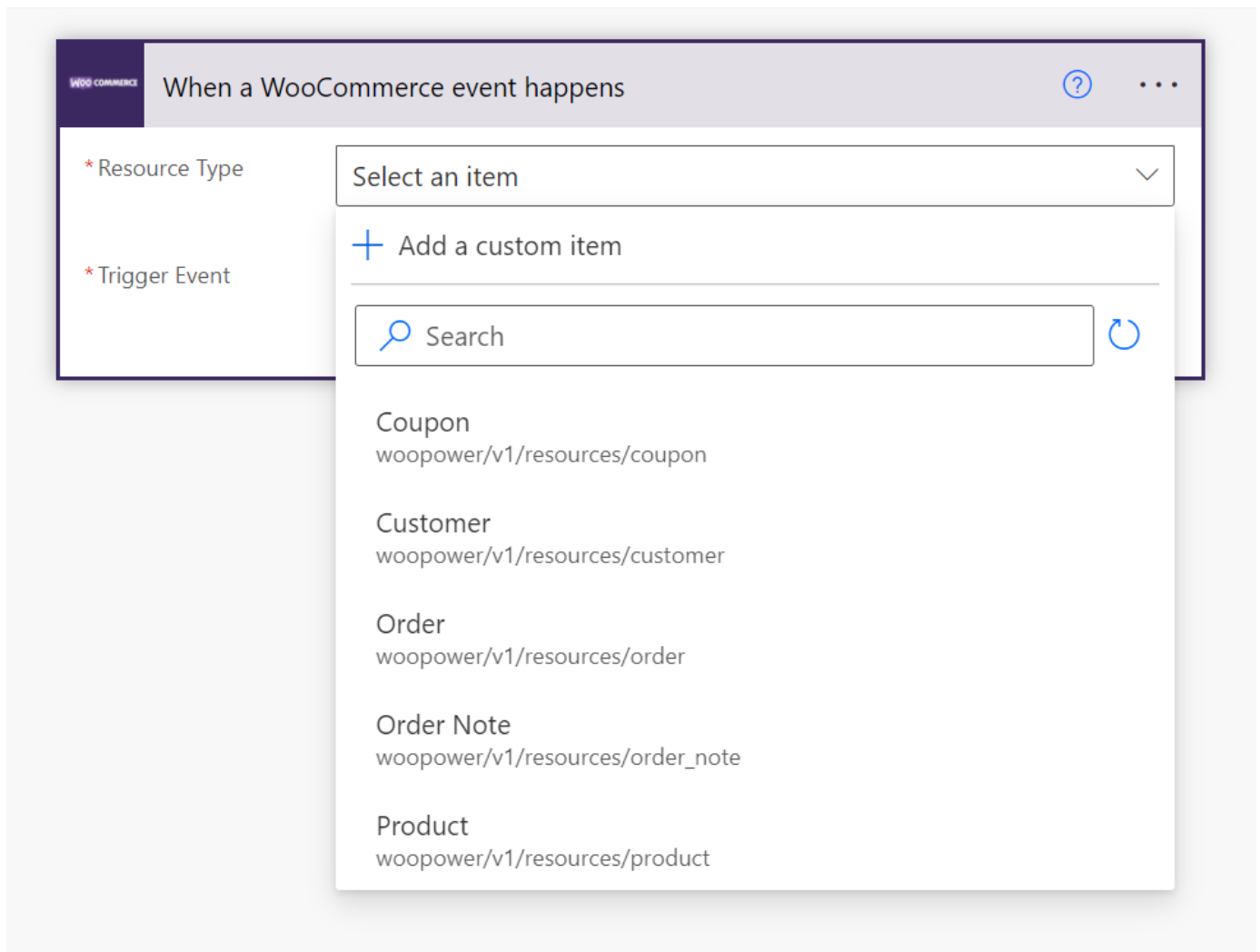

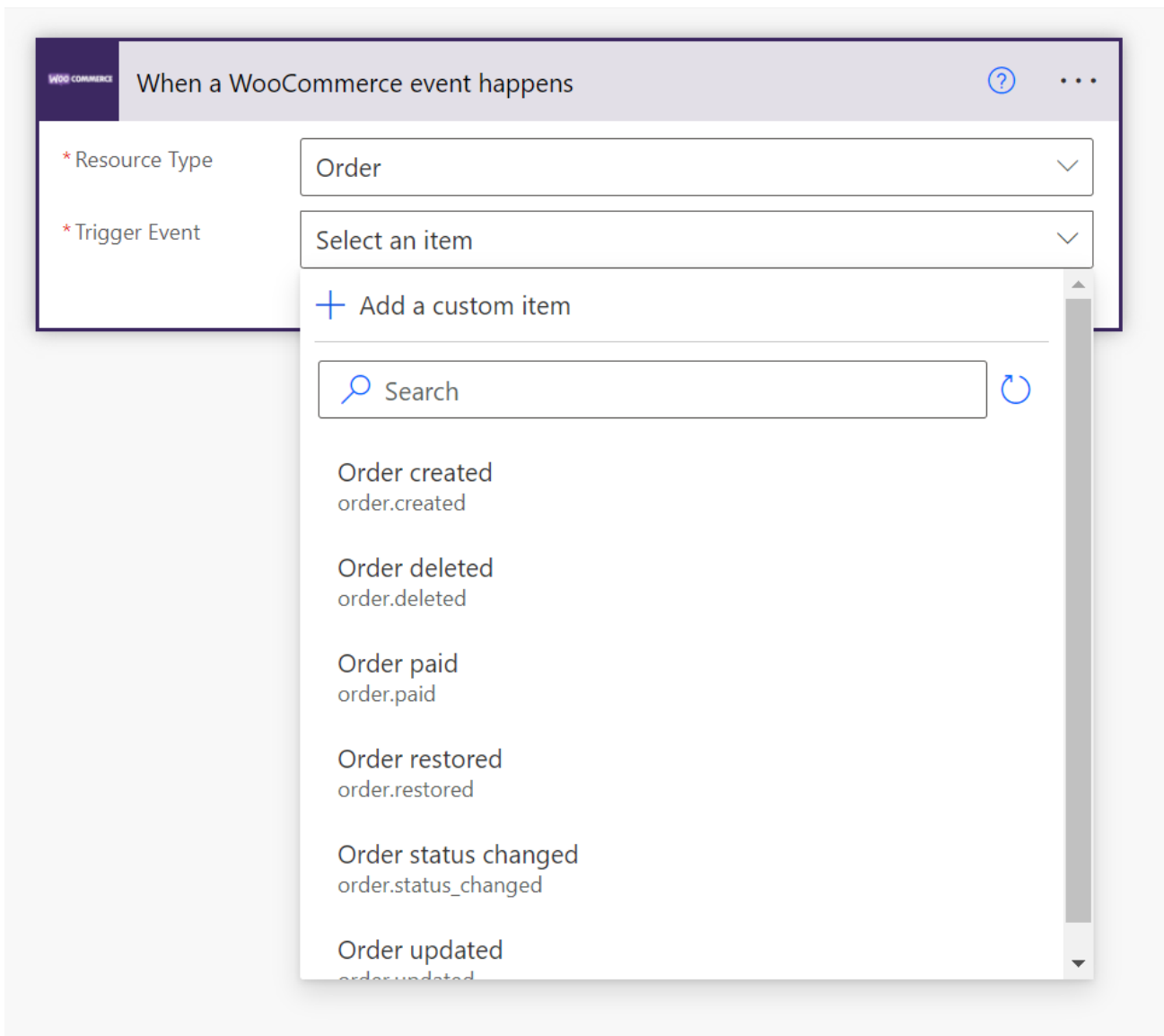

Once you are ready to use the trigger, you must **select what type of event** you want to start the flow:



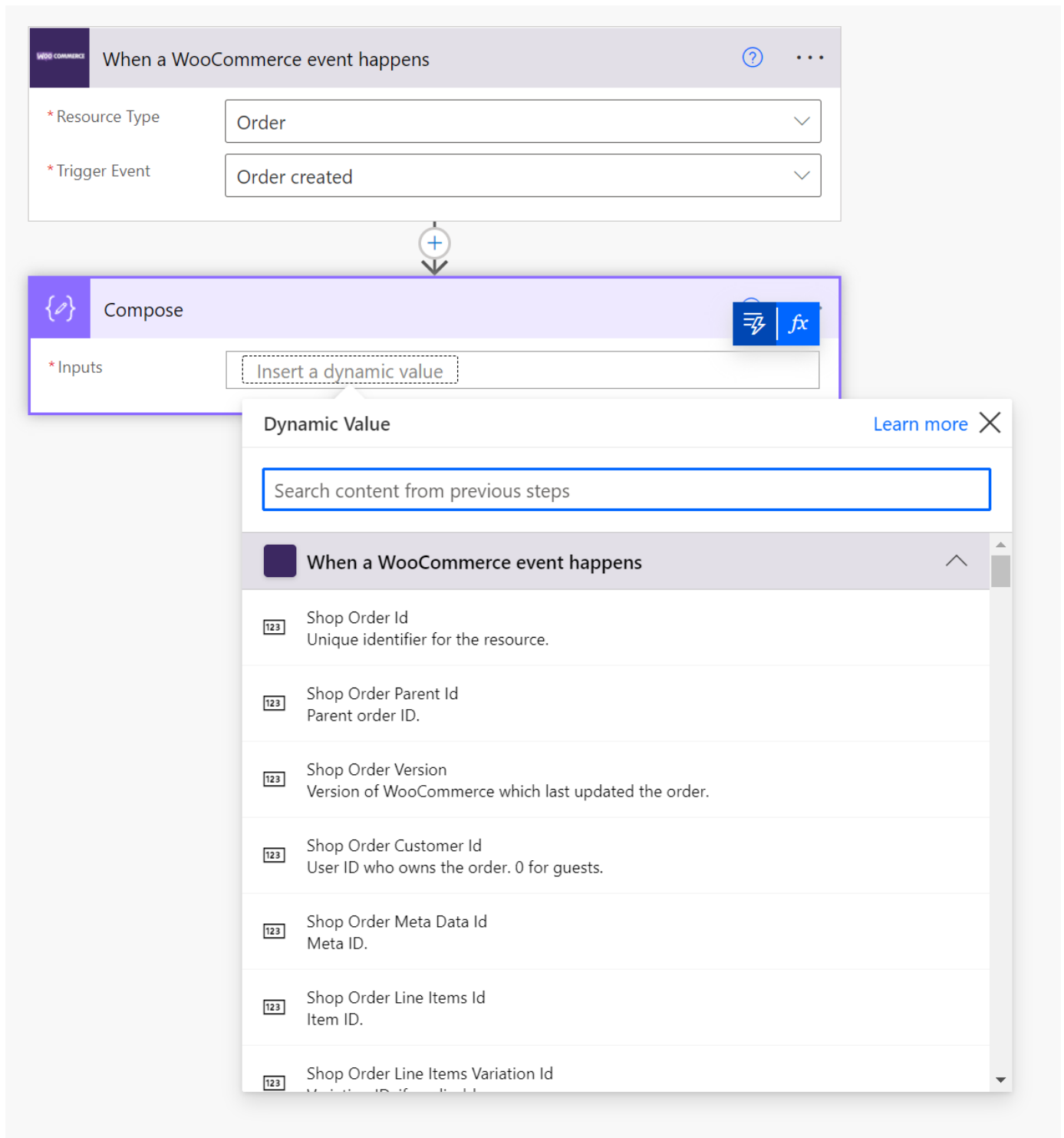
The list of resource types is configured based on what is provided by your store.

Then you must **select the trigger event**. When this event happens on your WooCommerce store, your flow will be started:



Each Resource Type provides different trigger types.

After you have configured your trigger, you can use the trigger outputs as **dynamic values** in future steps in your flow:



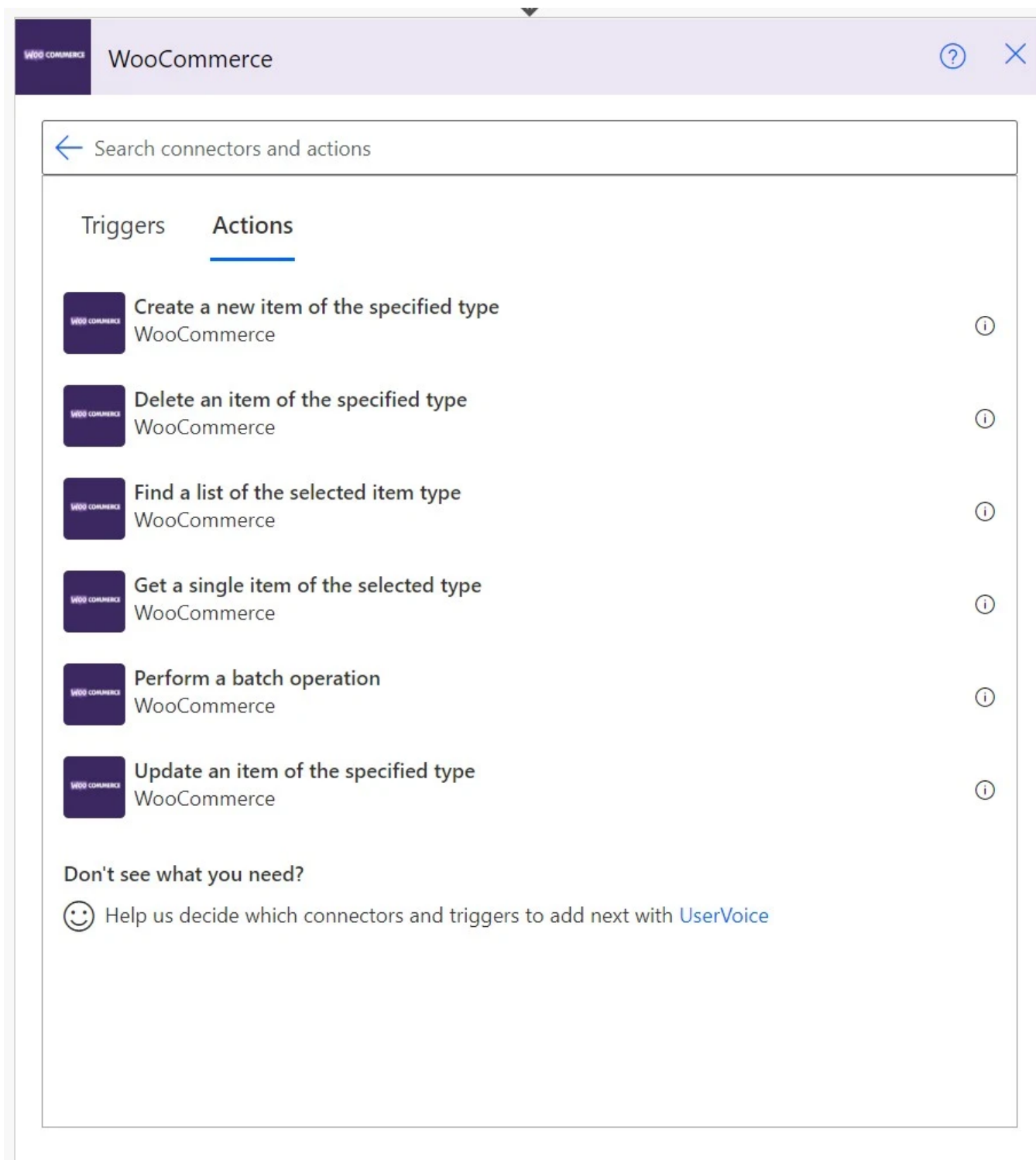
Depending on the Resource Type you select in your trigger, you will see different properties.

Actions: Perform actions in your WooCommerce store

This connector also supplies several actions, which you can use at any time in your flows.

First, press **New Step** and select the **WooCommerce** connector, you will see a list of actions

available:

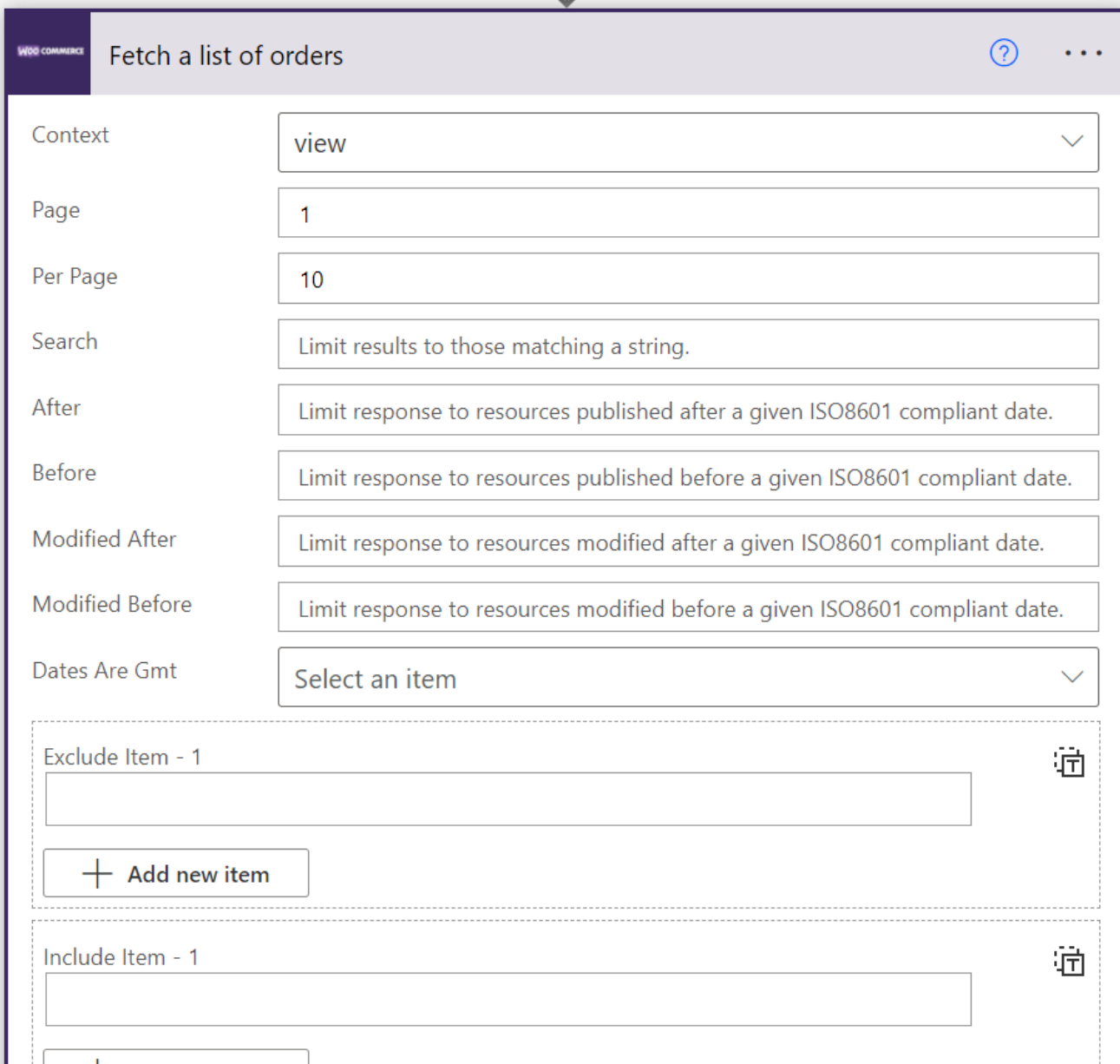


Many actions are available to you

If this is the first action you're using with WooCommerce, you will be prompted to **Create**

a **connection** which you can do by following the steps further above.

Each step you choose will present you with a list of parameters which you can use to refine the request or complete the operation:



Fetch a list of orders

Context: view

Page: 1

Per Page: 10

Search: Limit results to those matching a string.

After: Limit response to resources published after a given ISO8601 compliant date.

Before: Limit response to resources published before a given ISO8601 compliant date.

Modified After: Limit response to resources modified after a given ISO8601 compliant date.

Modified Before: Limit response to resources modified before a given ISO8601 compliant date.

Dates Are Gmt: Select an item

Exclude Item - 1

+ Add new item

Include Item - 1

+ Add new item

Each action allows full configuration
